Jane Austen, Author

Jane Austen (1775–1817) was an English novelist known primarily for her six novels, which implicitly interpret, critique, and comment upon the British landed gentry of the late 18th and early 19th centuries. Her novels include the anonymously published *Sense and Sensibility* (1811), *Pride and Prejudice* (1813), *Mansfield Park* (1814), and *Emma* (1816), followed by *Northanger Abbey* and *Persuasion*, both published posthumously in 1818. Austen began the novel that was eventually titled *Sanditon*, but died before its completion. She also left behind three volumes of early works, the short epistolary novel *Lady Susan*, and the unfinished novel *The Watsons*. Her novels have inspired many films, including *Pride and Prejudice* (1940), *Sense and Sensibility* (1995), and *Love & Friendship* (2016). 2025 marks Austen's 250th birthday, celebrated worldwide.

Adaptor

Emma Whipday is a playwright and Shakespeare scholar. She has adapted three Austen novels for the stage: *Pride and Prejudice* (originally for the American Shakespeare Center, 2024); *Emma* (ASC, 2019); and *Sense and Sensibility* (with Brian McMahon, 2017; revived at the ASC for summer 2025). Other plays include *The Defamation of Cicely Lee*, which won the ASC's Shakespeare's New Contemporaries award 2019, and *Shakespeare's Sister* (Samuel French, 2016), which won the Theatre Royal Haymarket's Masterclass *Pitch Your Play* award and received its international premiere at the ASC; it has been performed at universities, drama schools, and high schools internationally. Emma is Senior Lecturer in Renaissance Literature at Newcastle University, England; her book *Shakespeare's Domestic Tragedies* (Cambridge University Press, 2019) won the Shakespeare's Globe Book Award (2020). Emma also wrote the introduction to the new Oxford World's Classics *Measure for Measure*.


